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PETER: Andrew!! Nuts! ... This makes no sense ... I hate this, hate this, hate this ... Andrew!

ANDREW: Peter ... What are you bellowing about?

(He's looking for something.)

- PETER: You gotta help me with this.
- ANDREW: With what?
- PETER: The month's accounting.
- ANDREW: Uh uh. Gotta go.
- PETER: Andrew.
- ANDREW: It's your turn. Everybody has to take a turn.
- PETER: You know I'm never gonna get this right.
- ANDREW: Boy, look at the time.
- PETER: Didn't I just do this?
- ANDREW: How many months in a year?
- PETER: Twelve.
- ANDREW: How many of us are there?
- PETER: Twelve.
- ANDREW: So?

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	PETER:	I just did this, didn't I?		
	ANDREW:	A year ago.		
	PETER:	Judas isn't going to be happy with me.		
	ANDREW:	Judas is never happy with you.		
	PETER:	Come here, look at this. I can't even read this. Frgffcuwcfwucfw (<i>This</i> needs to be unintelligible. Trying to read unreadable writing—create your own.)		
	ANDREW:	Four loaves of bread and a small wheel of cheese. (<i>PETER just looks at him.</i>) What?		
	PETER:	(Picks up another scrap of paper.) Jytrdfwdtfruytfgjyg.		
	ANDREW:	A donation of four chickens and a goat.		
1	PETER:	You're kidding.		
	ANDREW:	Nope.		
	PETER:	Hthtdtwfluyuwylyw (A long one.)		
	ANDREW:	Food.		
	PETER:	Food.		
	ANDREW:	Bart's not very specific—it goes in the expense pile.		
	PETER:	This is ridiculous, I can't do this. Can't do it. I see numbers on paper, my mind goes numb.		
	ANDREW:	And that's different how?		
	PETER:	(Face contorted with hands.) Come on.		
	ANDREW:	Okay, I'm gonna explain this simply, with the least amount of accounting jargon.		
(PETER puts his hand up.)				
	ANDREW:	Yea?		
	PETER:	Now when you say jargon

ANDREW: PETER: Who? ANDREW: The mute guy. (A look.) You have stuff written down that a mute guy said. PETER: ANDREW: Ex-mute. PETER: I assumed. When? A group brought this deaf and mute man to Jesus... ANDREW: (Still looking... lost in his searching.) PETER ...brought a deaf mute guy to Jesus. ANDREW: Right. (ANE	DREW shows the notes; PETER reads.)
PETER:	Jhgfghjewewtyghgbgew.
(Looks	s at ANDRFW like he needs interpretation)

(Looks at ANDREW like he needs interpretation.)

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Jhgfghjewewtyghgbgew. (Repeats exactly as PETER has pronounced it.) ANDREW: That's what he said. PETER: Jhgfghjewewtyghgbgew? (*Repeats exactly.*) ANDREW: His first sentence ever. PETER: Okay. ANDREW: (Shows him some more.) Ktfrytwfkutyut. Ktyufewtyuvutyeouewtyyt. Kjyfweutyvweukyyvwuyey. PETER: And this is what you needed to write down. Yea ... Then Jesus puts his hands on the man's lips and the man said ... I ANDREW: hear the birds ... and your breathing ... thank you ... wow. PETER: Wow ... what did Jesus say? ANDREW: Shhhhh. PETER: (Quietly.) What did Jesus say? ANDREW: Don't tell anyone. PETER: (*Quietly.*) I won't. ANDREW: No, that's what he said, "Don't tell anyone."
